

THE GREATER AKRON AQUARIUM SOCIETY

WHO ARE WE? We are a local group of aquatic enthusiasts. Formed in 1952, the Greater Akron Aquarium Society is a non-profit, non-commercial organization. Our membership ranges from the beginning hobbyist to the advanced aquarist with many years of experience. The goals of our club are to promote the care, study, breeding and exhibition of aquarium related aquatic life and to promote interest in the aquarium hobby.

MEETINGS: Our meetings are held on the first Thursday of each month at 8:00 p.m. at the Mogadore Community/Senior Center, 3857 Mogadore Road, Mogadore, Ohio. It is located East of Route 532 across from McDonald's in the former post office building. Visitors are always welcome, it costs absolutely nothing to attend a meeting and look us over.

MEMBERSHIP: The cost is only \$10 for adults, a couple or a family (includes children under 10 years of age) and \$5.00 for a junior membership (10 to 17 years) Membership provides an opportunity to socialize with others that share your interests, a subscription to our bi-monthly magazine and more.

AGENDA: Our meeting agenda is simple and informal. The meeting will begin at 8:00 p.m. with a short business meeting. Immediately following is the program for the evening which usually lasts about 45 minutes. Our programs consist of a speaker, slide program, movie or perhaps a panel discussion always on a particular subject related to the hobby or various species of fish. Following the program is a short refreshment break. After which the winners of the Bowl Show are announced, the Breeder's Award Program fish are auctioned and tickets are drawn for the raffle.

THE BOWL SHOW: Each month members can bring in fish for specific classes to compete for first, second and third place awards. The charge for each entry is only \$.25. Members also compete for annual awards by accumulating wins throughout the year.

BREEDER'S AWARD and HORTICULTURE AWARD PROGRAMS: members can receive recognition for spawning species of fish or propagating aquatic plants. All that is required is to turn in a minimum of six fry from the spawn that are between 30 and 90 days old. Members earn certificates for each species and can work towards plaques in different categories.

EQUIPMENT RAFFLE: The raffle table has such items as tanks, fish food and aquarium accessories that are donated by national manufacturers, area dealers or purchased by the Society. Tickets may be purchased by anyone attending the meeting. Save your losing tickets for the Christmas Party raffle.

ANNUAL SHOW: The Ultra-Aqua show is held during the summer at the Tallmadge community Center. This has become one of the largest all-species tropical fish shows in North America. It is an international gathering of hobbyists to display their fish in class competition, talk fish and to learn about the hobby from each other.

TANK TOPICS: is published on a bi-monthly basis for the members of the Greater Akron Aquarium Society. Articles and comments for this publication are welcome and encouraged. Such articles are to be submitted no later than the board meeting prior to publication. All articles may be reprinted as long as the author(s) and GAAS are given proper credit and two copies of the publication containing the reprint are sent to GAAS. 





DIY Corner – Mat Filter Corner Box

Hamburg Mattenfilter, they're efficient, long lasting, low maintenance, cheap to run and also a big slab of foam across one side of your tank. Not familiar with foam mat filters? I recommend going to

www.swisstropicals.com

and check out their library and FAQ link, a lot of good information all in one place. So what do you do if you want to use a mat filter in your show tank and not just something in your fish room? You can always put it in the corner by siliconing in glass rods, as shown by the corner filter and halfmoon filter section on swiss tropicals. But what do you do if your tank is up and running; draining it to silicone in the rods would be problematic.

Enter our project today: a DIY drop-in acrylic filter box to hold our mat filter.

Materials Needed
Acrylic pieces
Acrylic solvent
Tape (painters tape works

well) (Optional) Aquarium safe acrylic paint



The Build

-I built mine out of 0.118 inch acrylic sheets from Lowes. You can use a thicker sheet if you want, there is a bit of flex on bigger boxes, especially towards the top from the force of the bent foam sheets. They did most of the cuts in store for my 120g build, for this 10g build I used a jigsaw with an 8 tooth per inch wood blade. If you've never worked with acrylic before, there are a ton of guides online to help.

-We start off by measuring the inside height to the rim and width of our tank.
We're going to need 5 pieces of acrylic for each filter.
This particular one was for a 10g tank using scraps left from my main tank box build.



2 supports – 1 ½ inches by inside height to rim minus ¼ -1/2 inch for base and tank seal clearance

2 sides – half of tank width by same height as supports 1 bottom piece, square, roughly an inch longer than half width of your side pieces

(My preference for the next step is to put the box together using to make sure everything fits together and your edges are smooth and even to avoid gaps and weak spots.) Tank Topics Page 9



-Using Scigrip/Weldon 4 in an applicator bottle, run a bead along the inside creases; starting with one of the vertical pieces, press together for 30 seconds before going to the next one. Do the base last and let cure. After 10 minutes, I applied another bead of solvent and pressed again to help fill in any gaps. (If preferred, Scigrip/Weldon 16 can be used, just build the box as you go instead of taping first.)

-Once dried, remove the tape, sand down any rough edges and paint the supports to match your filter color. (The painting can be skipped, but over time filter mud will accumulate between the clear acrylic and the foam, and give you a nice brown line.) Follow the directions on the paint, fail-

ure to do so is a very easy way to kill your fish. Colored acrylic sheets may be used as well, but the store had clear, so I used clear.

-Trim down your foam to fit. Using a ruler or a board to compress the foam and be a guideline combined with a good sharp knife will help to keep your cut line even and clean. The foam cuts very easily if you haven't had to cut any before.

-Place the foam into the filter box, make cut-outs or holes for your pump/airlift/ power head (make these cuts with the foam in the filter so you remove the right amount of material. -Clear substrate away around where base of box will go, place in aquarium and cover base plate back with substrate to hold in place. If desired or needed, a few aquarium safe rocks can be placed inside the box behind the foam to weigh it down.





Pictured is one of the boxes used in my main tank setup, a 5ft 120g in the middle with 44g pentagon corner tanks on either side.
